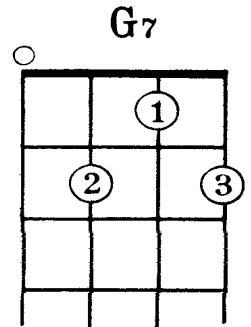


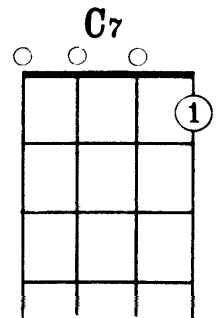

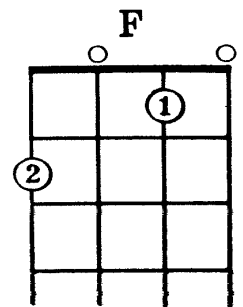

The lyrics of this love song suggest that the composer was a sailor aboard Ka-pueo-kahi, an inter-island schooner which was named for a place near Hana, Maui (named for the owl god). It sailed the Hawaiian waters in the 1870's including Mamala (Honolulu Bay) flying the proud Hawaiian flag.

Love comes from Ka -pueo-kahi
